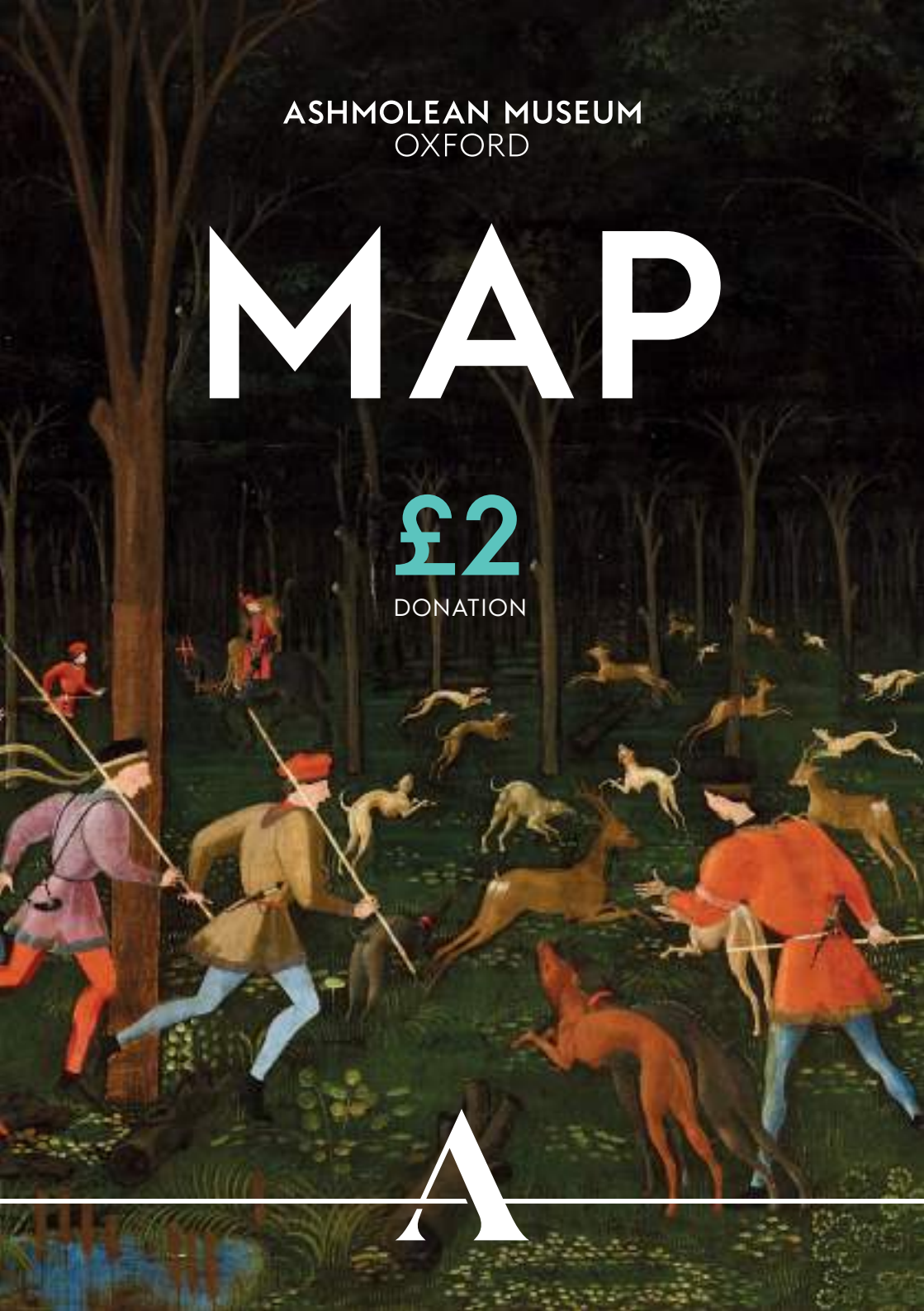

Welcome to the Ashmolean, the University of Oxford's museum of art and archaeology. Founded in 1683, we're Britain's first public museum, home to half a million years of human history and creativity, from ancient Egyptian mummies to contemporary art.

As you travel up through the Museum our collections transport you through time, from the ancient world to the present day.

On **Level -1**, explore how civilisations developed as part of a connected world culture.

On **Level G** find out how travel brought the ancient world together, including in Egypt, Greece and China.

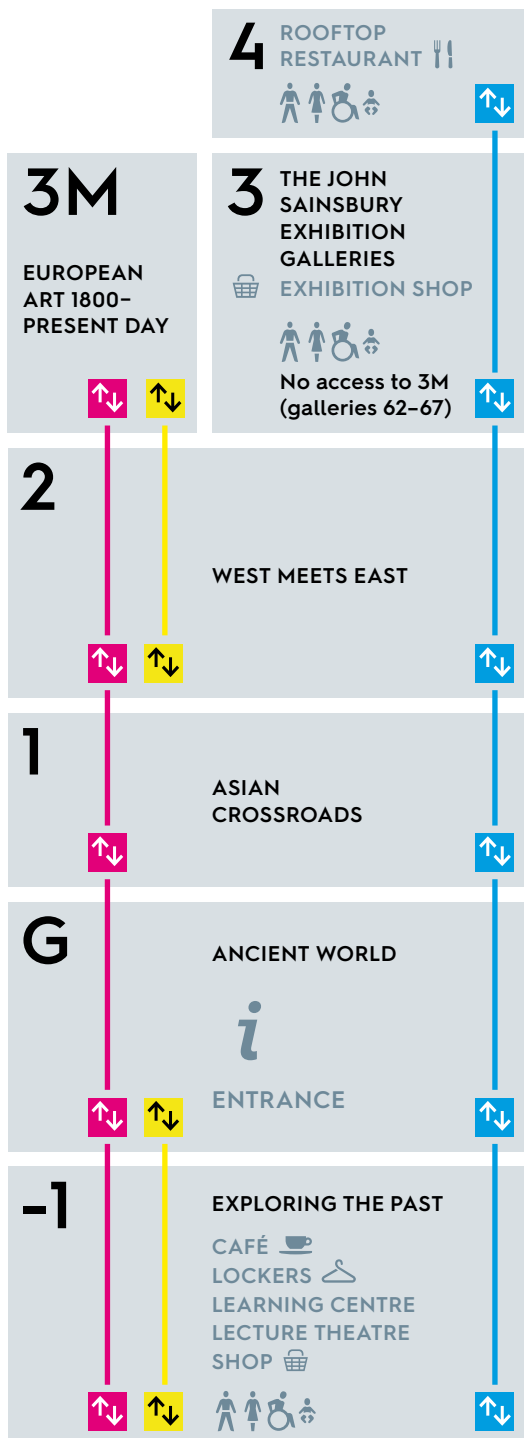
Explore the world of the Silk Road and sea trade routes between the Mediterranean and Asia on **Level 1**.

Discover how the East and West came into contact on **Level 2** through our Western Art, Japan and China collections.

Level 3 showcases a changing programme of major exhibitions.
