

Debuted on The National D-Day Museum's opening on June 6, 2000—this exhibit tells the story of the American effort during the largest-ever amphibious invasion on June 6, 1944. Through the exhibit's Planning for Overlord and D-Day Beaches and Hedgerows galleries, visitors learn what the Allies faced in France.

Richard C. Adkerson & Freeport-McMoRan Foundation Road to Tokyo: Pacific Theater Galleries LEVEL 2

Road to Tokyo retraces the grueling path that led from Pearl Harbor to Tokyo Bay, highlighting critical naval warfare as well as air and land campaigns. Galleries explore the bloody battle for Guadalcanal and fighting in Southeast Asia, the Himalayas, Burma, China, India, and Alaska.

In Honor of David W. Trott Finding Hope in a World Destroyed LEVEL 1

The first floor honors the sacrifices of the WWII generation and explores the immense cost of the war with exhibits on the Holocaust, Anne Frank, faith in wartime, and the Monuments Men and Women.



Goldring Family Foundation and Woldenberg Foundation Forces of Freedom at Home and Abroad (1945-Present) LEVEL 2

The second floor explores the war's impact in the postwar period and its lasting legacies today. Exhibits examine the rebuilding efforts of a world destroyed, the war crimes trials, the emergence of the United States as a world "superpower," movements for social change and civil rights, new technological innovations, and the war's impact on foreign policy.

HALL OF DEMOCRACY

Hall of Democracy is the home of the Museum's Jenny Craig Institute for the Study of War and Democracy and WWII Media and Education Center. Some of the sprawling pavilion's features include a fully equipped media auditorium, new exhibition hall, an education classroom, and a Museum Store outlet. The complex serves as a hub for disseminating WWII knowledge through online access to Museum initiatives, products, distance-learning activities, and digital programs.



The Senator John Alario, Jr. Special Exhibition Hall LEVEL 1

Located on the first level of Hall of Democracy, this hall is dedicated to featuring full-scale traveling and institution-produced special exhibits, including those focused on lesser-known stories from the war.
