ASU Police

Located on all ASU campuses, the ASU Police Department is a full-service, 24-hour campus police force. Its crime prevention unit coordinates a variety of safety training classes to ensure all students know how to avoid or react to any unsafe situation.

Emergency call boxes

Located throughout all ASU campuses and parking structures, emergency call boxes are marked with a bright blue light and connect directly to the ASU Police Department.

Key card access buildings

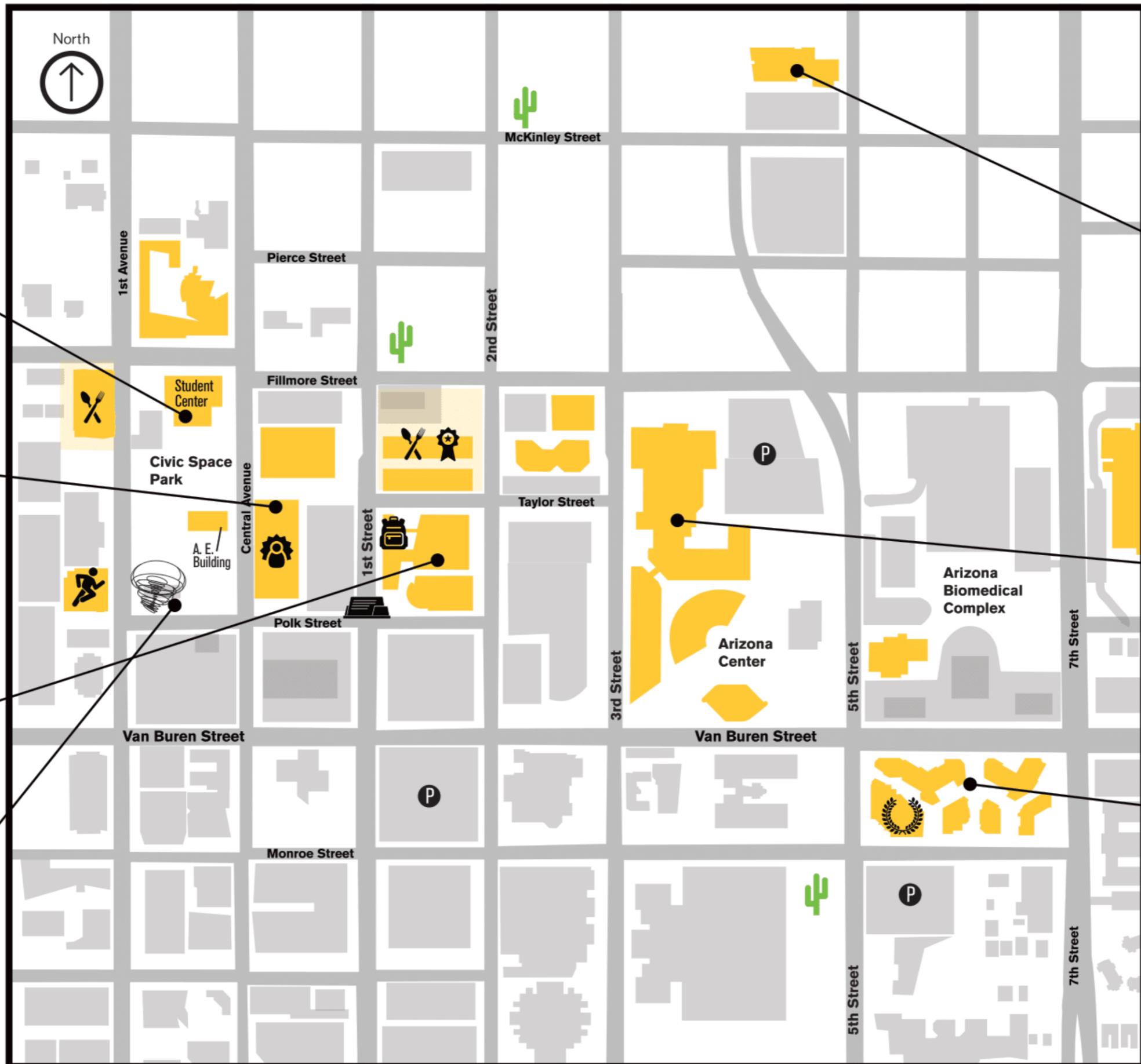


The **Post Office** is half historical building (oldest surviving post office in Phoenix) and half ASU building (designed by students for students and has a pool table, foosball table, TVs and a lounge to study).

University Center Building is the hub of the Downtown Phoenix campus, with classrooms, labs, seminar rooms, study areas, the library, the bookstore and a cafe.

The **Beus Center for Law and Society** building is located in the legal, political and economic heart of Arizona. In addition to the law college, the BCLS building houses the Ross-Blakley Law Library, a bookstore and a cafe, several cross-disciplinary centers and the ASU Alumni Law Group.

"Her Secret is Patience" is a sculpture designed by artist Janet Echelman. The sculpture consists of painted galvanized steel, polyester twine netting and colored lights. It's named after a phrase used by Ralph Waldo Emerson to describe the elements of Arizona nature.



The **850 PBC** building is a seven-story, 227,000-square-foot, lab-enabled building offering opportunities for collaboration and access to state-of-the-art equipment. From promoting health to the treatment of disease, College of Health Solutions researchers collaborate with the community aiming to shorten the time from discovery to clinical practice.

Arizona Center is full of entertainment, shopping, events and dining that create an engaging, centralized hub. It is a prime place to grab a bite to eat or stroll through the courtyard. ASU classrooms and offices are located here as well.

Mercado is comprised of six Spanish-style buildings accommodating a variety of ASU classrooms and offices.
